The primary type of accommodation at Kohut is a wood cabin with large screened windows, basic electricity, restrooms and showers with private stalls, and spacious cubby rooms for clothing and gear. Each cabin has a porch with benches for conversation, reading, or relaxing.

These cabins form two rows on the boys' and girls' sides of the bunk lines, with grassy lawns in between for playing games and spending time with friends. Although they vary slightly in size and shape, a typical cabin houses between eight to twelve campers and three to four counselors.

Our directors and leadership team are closely involved with cabin life, regularly going in and out of the cabins to connect with campers and staff, ensuring a kind, comfortable, and happy cabin environment.










FACILITIES

Kamp Kohut encompasses one half mile of shore frontage on Lake Thompson, a beautiful spring-fed, crystal-clear, eleven mile long Maine lake. We also have abundant playing fields, recreational areas, and indoor facilities for campers to use in their pursuit of adventure and exploration.









UNIFORMS



Kamp Kohut is a uniform camp. We find having a uniform is another wonderful way to build a sense of unity, remove social pressure, and eliminate competition or a focus on appearance. It also reinforces our wholesome atmosphere and proves practical when doing our wide variety of activities. Our colors are royal blue and white for campers, navy blue and white for staff. A few logo'd items are required for special occasions and off camp trips.

HEALTHCARE



We have three nurses who work and live at Kamp, and are available any time of day or night to help with any medical problems or health issues. Our nurses are typically moms who are extra sensitive to children's needs, taking care of everything from administering medication to soothing tummy aches. They follow carefully drafted protocols given by our local family medicine practice group. The nearest hospital is 15 minutes away.

MEAL TIME



We really want meals to be a relaxed time for delicious and nutritious food, as well as great conversation. Meals are served "family style" at tables of six, with thoughtfully assigned seating to give children the opportunity to sit with friends and to meet other members of our Kamp community. Boys and girls eat at the same time but sit separately. Each mealtime includes a main course, supplemented by a wide variety of healthy and tasty choices.
